The collection contains official documents, books, correspondence, photographs, personal journals, memorabilia, ephemera, artifacts, photocopies, magazine, and newspaper clippings, all pertaining to trains, train stations, railroads, railroad architecture, domestic and international.

Biographical or Historical Information

James D. Dilts was a prolific author and legitimate authority on railroads, trains, and railroad-related architecture.

Dilts was born in New York City in 1937, and grew up in several towns in New Jersey, Buffalo, NY, and Providence RI. After graduating high school, he enlisted in the Navy and then went to Northwestern University on the GI Bill. He moved to Baltimore for a position at the Johns Hopkins Magazine and he remained there until his death in 2018.

Dilts had a life-long interest in the urban landscape and its architecture, public transportation, and especially trains. He had a column in the Sunday Sun called, "The Changing City," which described the physical changes of Baltimore neighborhoods during the late 1960s and early 1970s. He researched and wrote extensively about Baltimore architecture and led the effort to restore the historic Peale Building. His book publishing career spanned from the 1970s until the late 2010s, and includes but is not limited to the following major works: A Guide to Baltimore's Architecture (published January 1973, co-authored with John Dorsey); The Engineers, 1905-1980 (published 1980, co-authored with the Engineering Society of Baltimore); The Great Road: The Building of the Baltimore and Ohio, the Nation's First Railroad, 1828-1885 (published October 1993); Baltimore's Cast-Iron Buildings & Architectural Ironwork (published September 2009); A Bridge Over Time – The Thomas Viaduct 1835-2010 (published July 2010); The World Trains Made: A Century of Great Railroad Architecture in the United States and Canada (published September 2018).

Arrangement Note

All files are arranged from back of file box to front. Due to Dilts' deteriorating storage materials, the entire collection was rehoused out of necessity. Unless otherwise noted in the series and subseries descriptions, the arrangement schema for the collection was imposed during processing in the absence of a usable original order.



The intellectual arrangement is divided into 7 series with 35 corresponding sub-series. The series correlate with the major works of Dilts' life, particularly the books he published. Due to the heavy intersection of the materials, items were assigned a series based on a "best fit" mentality. An item's assignment to one series does not mean its access was restricted to one work by Dilts. Due to the timespan and scale of Dilts' career, it is likely that he reused many sources for several of his works. Researchers are encouraged to search for keywords with this document by using the search function on their computer (for PC users, Ctrl+F; for Mac users, Command+F).

Custodial History

The initial survey was conducted in December 2020-May 2021 by University of Maryland MLIS graduate student Genevieve Kocienda under the supervision of B&O archivist, Anna Kresmer, as part of Kocienda's field study requirement. On the last day of Kocienda's field study, another significant portion of the collection was discovered by another University of Maryland MLIS graduate student, Amy Lubinski. Lubinski overtook processing the collection in June 2021, including surveying the newly discovered materials, re-surveying the materials Kocienda had already processed, re-housing the materials, and creating a finding aid for the completed collection. Processing of the collection is expected to be completed by January 2022.

Source of Acquisition

The collection was donated to the B&O Railroad Museum by Dilts' wife, Penny Williamson on July 12, 2018, after her husband's death. The collection was picked up at Williamson's home by former B&O Railroad Museum archivist Allison Seyler and B&O Railroad Museum volunteers Bob Ullrich and Dan Zink. The collection was transported to the museum and stored in Mt. Clare for processing.

Accruals and Additions

Additional items related to this collection (objects, books, magazines, VHS tapes, film reels) are to be processed separately in 2022.
